RAILWAY SERVICE DISORGANIZED

Two G. T. R. Preight Tealus Get Into Trouble-Passenger | Trains Delayed-Xo Injuries Reported.

A rear-end collision of two Grand Trunk freight trains occurred last night at Port Credit. The accident happened shortly before? a clock a short distance west of Port Credit on the main line of the Grand Trunk, over which the C.P. It, passenger trains also pass.
