- 4.2.On December 4, 1906, G.P.&H. Electric Railway and P.&B. Railway Preston barns burned. eight passenger cars and a locomotive destroyed. Freight motor and two passenger cars out on line at the time <u>and were</u> saved. One of the eight cars burned only had the end damaged by fire but was serviceable for use in the emergency shortage of cars.
