cident was caused when a box car and a coal car apparently became freed from their train and, running loose, crashed into the standing work train from Temiskaming, Que., toppling the engine and one of the cars down a steep embankment along the Ottawa river. The wreck was within sight of the town's main street. Within a few hours the track had been cleared.

The fireman and engineer are believed to have been thrown clear of the plunging engine, but Cauchy was trapped within. When other crew members reached the scene, he was almost totally buried by coal from the tender. All three men in the engine were badly scalded.


