A very serious accident, which caused a heavy loss of property, but was fortunately unattended by any loss of life, occurred on the Grand Trunk on Saturday night. Owing to a blunder on the part of Mr. Charles Brown, relieving agent, in opening a wrong switch, a special freight train going west from Cambachie was sent along the same line on which No. 26 freight was proceeding east from Sarnia. The drivers of the approaching trains did not see each other. owing to a curve on the road, until it was too late to stop the engines. They and the fremen had just time to jump before the ongines met with a terrific clash. The two locomotives rolled down the embankment, and seventeen cars were smashed to pieces. The boilers exploded, and the d. bris tack fire, but the flames were quenched before they chained headway by the conductors and brakpinen. Mr. Brown, who has been in the service of the company for severel years, and who has hitherto proved an efficient officer, was placed under arrest.
