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# FOUR KILLED IN HASTINGS

G. T. R. Near Madoc.

Persone Injured-Explosion Kills Two Men at Belmont Mine.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Belleville, July 26 .- A fatal railway accident occurred on the Midland division of the G.T.R. at 1.25 o'clock this afternoon, when two passenger trains collided half a mile south of Madoc Junction and two lives were lost. Madoc train, due to leave here shortly after noon, was delayed waiting western connection. It passes the Peterboro' express at Madoc Junction, but, being delayed, did not make the Junction in time, and the Peterbero' train did not remain there. Where the accident took place there is a bad curve, and the trainmen did not perceive one another's trains until too late. The two came together with terrible force, and Engineman Archie Edmunds of Lindsay and Brakeman Samuel Burd of Belleville were instantly killed. ## A FREIGHT WRECK.

A Fireman injured-Crews Saved Their Lives by Jamping-Reiling Stock Loss Heavy.
